Administration and	Submit all reports as requested by Netball SA.
Compliance:	Attend in season and post season meetings as required.

	Complete and adhere to all Netball Australia Integrity in Netball requirements; and
	Adhere to all Netball SA policies, in particular the Umpires code of conduct.
Practical Involvement:	Attend all squad meeting/development opportunities as required.
	Attend Pre-season training as required.
	Umpire matches in the THRFG Premier League or AMND competitions as allocated.

Attend Region events and identify athletes in own region where possible. **Work Health and Safety** Your duties are to: Comply with all Netball SA policies, procedures, and relevant legislation. The Umpire Squad are required to undertake two yo-yo tests, one prior to acceptance into the squad and one mid-season. A minimum 15.1 must be obtained for inclusion in the squad and improved results at second test.

- Current National Umpire Badge B, A or AA.
- Be current with umpiring procedures and protocols and apply them effectively and efficiently.
- Current Member of Netball SA.
- A current South Australian Drivers Licence or ability to attend as required.
- Successful applicants will be required to satisfy the requirements of a Working with Children Check.
- Comprehensive understanding of the INF Rules of Netball.
- Current Rules of Netball Theory Exam.
- Ability to work collaboratively in a team to maximise objectives.
- Strong communication skills, both written and verbal.
- Demonstrated ability to take direction, follow guidelines and accept feedback: and
- Ability to establish and maintain positive working relationships with and be accessible to key stakeholders including the High-Performance Panel members, Premier League Club Personnel and Netball SA staff.
